Who's Who in the Cast

Samantha Freier (Lenny) is very excited to be a part of this semester's production of Crimes of the Heart. She is a Senior Theatre major and this is her fourth main stage show. You may have also seen her in The Rope (Palaestra), Hayfever (Sorel), and in As You Like It (Rosalind). She is also an active member of Kutztown's academic theatre fraternity, Alpha Psi Omega. She couldn't be happier to be tackling a challenging role like Lenny, who's sensitive and seemingly fragile character gives Sam an opportunity to work outside of her comfort zone and show versatility in her acting.

David Krater (Doc Porter) is a junior Theatre Major and is thrilled to be back on the KU main stage. He was last seen in *The Bald Soprano* (The Fire Chief) He was also in *J.B.* (First soldier and First Policeman), and in The Sunshine Players production of *Alexander and the Terrible Horrible No Good Very Bad Day* (Adult Man).

Jillian Mirenzi (Chick) is a junior Theatre Major at Kutztown University. She was last seen on the KU main stage last fall in J.B. as Rebecca/Jolly. Other credits include: South Pacific (nurse/ensemble), Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day (Nick), The Wizard of Oz (The Wicked Witch of the West), Guys and Dolls (Vernon), Bye Bye Birdie (Margie), and The Boyfriend (Madame Dubbonet). She is excited to be working with such a wonderful cast and crew on this production.

Shoshana Roberts (Meg) is a sophomore Theatre Major and is excited to be acting in her first Kutztown University main stage production. Shoshana has contributed to multiple Kutztown shows by working on deck and makeup crews, and has spent many hours in the scene and costume shops. Last spring she was assistant stage manager for Sunshine Players' *Schoolhouse Rock Live!* Previous to KU, Shoshana came from Pittsburgh's High School for the Creative and Performing Arts.

Tyler Schnabel (Barnette) is a junior Theatre Major at Kutztown University. This is his third Main Stage performance. Previous plays include *J.B.* (Solider #2, Bildad) and *As You Like It* (Adam). Having been performing since the age of six, Tyler plans to continue his acting aspiration in graduate school somewhere in California after his final days spent in Kutztown.

Eva Marie Wasko (Babe) is ecstatic to be back on the KU Mainstage, after last appearing in Hay Fever (Jackie Coryton) and understudying the role of Laura Wingfield in The Glass Menagerie. At KU, she has also performed the title role in the Sunshine Players' production of Alice in Wonderland and stage managed The Bald Soprano, for which she was awarded a KCACTF Certificate of Merit. A junior theatre major and speech communication and public relations minor, Eva is proud to serve as the student trustee on the KU Council of Trustees, president of Spotlight Players, and treasurer of Alpha Psi Omega.

Artistic and Production Staff

Guy William Molnar (Director) is in his first year at Kutztown University as Assistant Professor of acting and directing. He is a Designated Linklater Voice Teacher. Previously he taught acting, directing, voice and Shakespeare at Florida State University, The North Carolina School of the Arts, the Conservatory of Theatre at Webster University, and the Interlochen Center for the Arts. He holds a Master of Fine Arts in acting from the University of South Carolina's Professional Actor Training program. He has acted and/or directed around the country at The Shakespeare Theatre in Washington DC, Riverside Shakespeare, the Arizona Theatre Company, Michigan Ensemble Theatre, Interlochen, and the Utah Shakespearean Festival, among others. Favorite experiences as a director have included Twelfth Night, Romeo and Juliet, The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Much Ado About Nothing, and Les Liaisons Dangereuses. Favorite roles have included Leontes in The Winter's Tale, Benedick in Much Ado, Archibald Craven in The Secret Garden, Caius Lucius in Cymbeline, Duke Frederick in As You Like It, The Duke/Dr. Carrasco in Man of La Mancha, Edward the Sergeant of Police in The Pirates of Penzance, Larkin in Six Degrees of Separation, Bernard in Arcadia, and Judge Turpin in Sweeney Todd. A musician as well as an actor and director, he holds a Master of Music in piano performance from Winthrop University, and is a proud member of Actors' Equity Association.

William F. Moser (Scenic Design) is an Assistant Professor of design. He has designed sets and/or costumes for such New York theatre companies as Naked Angels, Willow Cabin Theatre, and the Jean Cocteau Repertory. He has designed new works by such writers as Terrance McNally, Craig Lucas, and John Robin Baitz. Other New York credits include Il Re Pastore (NY Chamber Opera), The Comedy of Errors (Judith Shakespeare Company), and Arms and the Man (Theatre by the Blind). William has been an Associate Designer or Assistant on over twenty Broadway shows, countless Regional Theatre productions, and numerous National Tours including Broadway: A Class Act, Urban Cowboy, Judgment at Nuremburg, The Rainmaker, Into the Woods, 42nd St, Regional Theatres: Old Globe Theatre, Chicago Shakespeare Theatre, Pittsburgh Public Theatre, The Guthrie Theatre, The Huntington Theatre, and National Tours: Jekyll and Hyde, The Gin Game, and The Belle of Amherst. William holds an MFA from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts and has been a master teacher of design at the University of Iowa and Wayne State University. William is a member of United Scenic Artist 829.

Katherine Garlick (Costume Design) has returned to KU as both a designer and costume shop manager. Past KU designs include *The Glass Menagerie* and *The Bald Soprano*. A Pennsylvania native, Katherine earned her bachelor's in theatre from Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and was accorded as the first-runner up for KCACTF's Barbizon Award. Katherine holds an MFA in Costume Design from Indiana University, Bloomington, where her design work earned her recognition as part of USITT's Young Designer's Forum in 2007. Since then, she has worked in a mixture of professional and academic theatres. Some favorite venues include the Contemporary American Theatre Company, Brown County Playhouse, the Bloomington Early Music Festival, the Ohio State University Opera, and Weston Playhouse.

Robert L. Smith (Lighting Design) has spent over forty years teaching design and designing for academic and professional theatres in New York, Virginia, Maryland, Missouri, and Washington. Professional design credits include Missouri's Arrow Rock Lyceum Theatre, New York's AMAS Musical Theatre, The New Dramatists, Westbeth Theatre, six years designing for Syracuse Stage and its forerunner, Syracuse Repertory Theatre, the Arkansas Repertory Theatre, A Contemporary Theatre, Theatre Center Philadelphia, the Jersey Lyric Opera, and the New Jersey Ballet. K. U. Mainstage credits include Rhinoceros, The Servant of Two Masters, Olympus on My Mind, Moon Over Buffalo, Dancing at Lughnasa, The Hot I Baltimore, The Seagull, The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Baby with the Bathwater, Iphigeneia at Aulis, Arms and the Man, The Threepenny Opera, Picnic, The Comedy of Errors, She Stoops to Conquer, Italian American Reconciliation, Lucky Stiff, R. U. R. (Rossum's Universal Robots), and The Children's Hour, Hay Fever, and Anatomy of Gray. Professor Smith has received an outstanding design award from KC/ACTF for his work at Kutztown. Professor Smith and his family breed registered Polypay sheep in Montgomery Country where they all live.

Sara Griswold (Makeup Design) is excited to be designing her final show at Kutztown University. She has worked on past productions such as RUR: Rossum's Universal Robots as a dresser and The Children's Hour (Agatha). Sara has also designed makeup for The Adventures of Peter Piper, for Sunshine Players in fall 2007, the senior seminar production of Rabbit Hole (2009) and will be designing another Sunshine show, A Hairy Tale. She has also been Assistant to the Designer for the spring 2006 production of Lucky Stiff, and Hay Fever in 2007. Sara has also been Assistant to the Director for Company and Little Shop of Horrors, as well as Assistant Stage Manager for last fall's production of The Glass Menagerie.

Austin Davidheiser (Technical Director) - has been a production manager, technical director, and master electrician, as well as a freelance designer and technician, for various theaters, events companies, and colleges in the Philadelphia area. In the summers, he is the Technical Director/Production Manager for the Pennsylvania Governor's School for the Arts, an intensive interdisciplinary arts program for gifted high school students. His recent design credits include She Stoops to Conquer, Italian American Reconciliation, Lucky Stiff, R. U. R. (Rossum's Universal Robots), and The Children's Hour at KU, as well as Laundry and Bourbon/Lone Star at Camden County College, Disengaged at Ohio University, and Pipeline [sets] for the PGSA Dance Concert.

Adrienne Y. Wrona (Stage Manager) is a senior Theatre Major. She has been on various crews for several KU main stage shows. Previously, Adrienne was Assistant Stage Manager of Little Shop of Horrors and was the Stage Manager of The Glass Menagerie and As You Like It. She has also done stage management and make-up design for Kutztown University's Sunshine Players and is currently the group's Vice President. In fall '06 she co-directed a children's show at the Kutztown Middle School. Last semester, Adrienne was seen in The Bald Soprano (Mrs. Smith) for which she received the Irene Ryan Scholarship nomination. Adrienne is President of the Rho Upsilon cast of Alpha Psi Omega, the National Honors Fraternity in Theatre.

Kelli Lynn Conkey (Asst. Stage Manager) is a junior Theatre Major and Advertising Minor here at Kutztown University. This is her first time assistant stage managing a show here at Kutztown. In the past, Kelli has been the Prop Run Head for The Bald Soprano and As You Like It. She is a member of Alpha Psi Omega, the National Honors Fraternity in Theatre. She also acted in other productions here such as For Colored Girls who have Considered Suicide when the Rainbow is Enuf and The Vagina Monologues. Kelli has spent two years on the cast of the Pennsylvania Renaissance Faire. Next semester, she will be appearing in The Lower Depths.

JT Murtagh (Asst. Stage Manager) is a freshman Theatre Major and this is his second time assistant stage managing for a KU main stage show. The aims of this national theater education program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theater production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for a response by a regional KCACTF representative, and selected students and faculty are invited to participate in KCACTF programs involving scholarships, internships, grants, and awards for actors, playwrights, designers, stage managers, and critics at both the regional and national levels.

Productions entered on the Participating level are eligible for inclusion at the KCACTF regional festival and can also be considered for invitation to the KCACTF national festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC in the spring of 2010.

Last year more than 1,400 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
