

Director's Notes

In 1931, a new theatre collective was formed n New York City. It was named The Group Theatre and it was founded by the trio of Harold Clurman, Cheryl Crawford, and Lee Strasberg. The Group was dedicated to creating an ensemble trained in the approach to acting developed by the Russian master, Konstantin Stanislavski. The Group was highly successful in its use of Stanislavski's work, and the subsequent productions of the House of Connelly, Success Story, and Men In White established The Group as a major artistic force n American Theatre. Clifford Odets was one of the members of The Group. He was an actor who turned to playwriting. He wrote Waiting for Lefty, which was produced by The Group in 1935. His writing beautifully suited the Stanislavski trained actors of The Group, and we thought it would work for our actors as well. Lefty . . . has proved to be an appropriate and rich text for our students to bring their imagination and creativity to, and they have enjoyed building the characters and relationships called for in the play.

We've paired *Lefty* . . . with two other short plays by David Ives, a contemporary playwright whose work is as vivid as Odets. Those plays are titled *Sure Thing* and *The Philadelphia*. We've put the three one-acts by these two master writers together to create a flow of scenes that let us share with you scenes of comedy and serious drama. The order of performance is:

She is also a member of APO and the current president of Kutztown's children's theatre group, Sunshine Players.

Carly Robinson (Betty, Bodygaurd) Carly is a sophomore Theatre major and is thrilled to be making her second appearance on the KU main stage. She was last seen as "Mariane" in *Tartuffe*. Previous roles include "Shprintze" in *Fiddler on the Roof*, "Betty Parris" in *The Crucible* and "Rachel" in *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*. Before attending Kutztown, Carly studied acting at the New Jersey School of Dramatic Arts. She has also worked backstage for several productions, in the areas of costuming, props and choreography.

Artistic and Production Staff

Professor James N. Brown (Director) began teaching at Kutztown in the fall of 2002. He has directed Baby With the Bathwater, Arms and the Man, She Stoops to Conquer, Comedy of Errors, and The Rope for the KU main stage. He holds an MFA in Theatre/Directing from the Florida State University School of Theatre. He is quite happy to have been a member of the production staff of the New York Shakespeare Festival/Public Theatre in the 1970's and 80's, and to have gotten to play at various way off-off-off Broadway theatres. In addition to teaching at KU, Mr. Brown has taught in the theatre programs at Auburn University in Montgomery, Alabama State University, the University of Florida, Clark-Atlanta University, and Kennesaw State University. In this region, he has performed in Patient A by Lee Blessing, for Philadelphia's Sympatico Theatre Project. He also understudied the role of "Porfiry" in the Arden Theatre Company's production of Cloud 9. He has also been seen in the World premiere of Christina Masciotti's Vision Disturbance, produced at the Yocum Institute for Arts Education and performed the role of "The Shoemaker" in Primary Stages production of The Elves and the Shoemaker.

Professor Robert Lewis Smith (Scenic and Lighting Designer) has spent forty-plus years designing for academic theatres and teaching Theatre Design, Theatre Production, and Theatre History in New Jersey, New York, Virginia, Maryland, Missouri, and Washington. Professional credits include designs for New York's AMAS Musical Theatre, The New Dramatists, Westbeth Theatre, Syracuse Stage (formally known as the Syracuse Repertory Theatre), the Arkansas Repertory Theatre, A Contemporary Theatre, Theatre Center Philadelphia, the Jersey Lyric Opera, New Jersey Ballet, and Arrow Rock Lyceum Theatre. Some recent KU Mainstage credits include scenery and/or lights for Iphigeneia at Aulis (S & L), Arms and the Man (S & L), The Threepenny Opera (S & L), Picnic (S & L), She Stoops to Conquer (S), Italian American Reconciliation (S), Lucky Stiff (S), Hay Fever (S), Anatomy of Grey (S & L), The Little Shop of Horrors (L), and Crimes of the Heart (L). Professor Smith serves as Associate Editor for Scene Design for Theatre Design and Technology, for which he has written articles on various topics. He has also written entries for several encyclopedias and most recently co-authored the chapter on Oliver Smith in Late & Great: American Designers 1960 - 2010. Here at KU he has just completed a 3-year stint as Department Chair for Speech Communication and Theatre. Professor Smith holds an M.F.A. in Design for the Stage from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts and completed doctoral course work in Theatre History, Dramatic Literature, Dramatic Criticism, and Art History at University of Missouri—Columbia. Professor Smith is an All Categories member (scenery, lights, costumes, and scenic painting) of United Scenic Artists (LU 829), the organization for professional stage designers in the United States.




